In May of 2017, the Sun Life Building garnered the prestigious BOMA "2017-2018 Historical Building of the Year" Award, which is presented by the **B**uilding **O**wners and **M**anagers **A**ssociation. This distinction rewards excellence in terms of dedication in the commercial real estate sector for a heritage building.

#### Illumination of the Sun Life Building

When night falls, the upper section of the Sun Life Building is illuminated. This enhancement magnifies the Building's imposing architecture within the context of the celebrations for Montréal's 375<sup>th</sup> Anniversary and Canada's 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. It also shines a spotlight on this architectural icon, which will be celebrating its own Centennial in 2018!

The illumination showcases the exceptional nature of this gem of built heritage in Montréal right above the 18-metre Corinthian columns that decorate the west façade on rue Metcalfe, starting at the 17th floor. This illumination was designed with sustainable development in mind. It uses economic energy sources and high-performance projectors, and respects the Building's heritage.

### First-aid training in the workplace

When someone falls victim to an accident or sudden illness, every minute counts, and it is important to have properly trained first aiders on site in the workplace at all times, regardless of the size of the company.

The Commission des normes, de l'équité, de la santé et de la sécurité du travail (CNESST) subsidizes training for first-aiders in the workplace. The 16-hour training course is given by organizations that are contracted by the CNESST, which provides all employers with information related to the first-aid training program.

To register a worker for "First-Aid Training in the Workplace", the employer must complete the <u>Application Form for First-Aid Training</u> and send it to the <u>training</u> organization of its choice. (http://www.csst.qc.ca/formulaires/Documents/1843web.pdf)

#### Work

The return of the nice weather also marks the return of initiatives related to the ongoing maintenance of the appearance, quality, properties and proper functioning of the amenities at the Sun Life Building. The cleaning of the Building's west façade (rue Metcalfe) will be completed by the end of June. This will be followed by repointing work on the balconies and balustrades, which will continue until the fall. After that work is completed, the public washrooms located on the main floor will be closed for a few weeks in August for renovations.

#### **Operations Centre**

The Operations Centre, where the Building's Security Department is located, will be moving to new offices near the reception desk, with the entrance door located on one side of the main lobby. The Security Department issues access cards and welcomes service providers. For emergency situations (fire, bomb alert, medical emergency), call 911, and then inform the Building's Security Department, at 514-393-7700, in order to facilitate access for outside emergency services.

#### Respect the "smoke-free" zones

We would like to request that those occupants of the Sun Life Building who smoke please demonstrate civic-mindedness and comply with the **Tobacco Control Act**, which provides for designated "smoke-free" zones. These are located within a radius of nine metres from the main entrances and stairs. These "smoke-free" zones also apply to electronic cigarettes. Smokers are asked to note that these areas are also "butt-free zones"!

He reminds us that the first line of response is controlling access to a location. Undesirable individuals who are intent on infiltrating certain locations use the tailgating technique at elevators or near entrance doors on individual floors. This manoeuvre involves closely following someone into a secure space in order to take advantage of his or her authorized access to enter the location to which the person should not have access.
